| Sentence | He always has such a miserable expression on his face. |

| Word | Replica (noun) |
| Meaning | <i>an exact copy of an object</i> |
| Sentence | The ship is an exact replica of the original Golden Hind. |

| Word | Souvenir (noun) |
| Meaning | <i>something you buy or keep to help you remember a holiday or special event</i> |
| Sentence | He bought a model of a red London bus as a souvenir of his trip to London. |

| Meaning | <i>to make a series of small, weak sounds, expressing pain or unhappiness</i> |
| Sentence | I said she couldn't have an ice cream and she started to whimper . |

| Meaning | to announce something clearly, firmly, publicly, or officially |
| Sentence | They declared their support for the proposal. |
