

Word	Rumble (verb)
Meaning	<i>to make a continuous low sound</i>
Sentence	<i>Please excuse my stomach rumbling - I haven't eaten all day.</i>

Word	Howl (verb)
Meaning	<i>to make a loud sound, usually to express pain, sadness, or another strong emotion</i>
Sentence	<i>An injured dog lay in the middle of the road, howling with pain.</i>

Word	Flicker (verb)
Meaning	<i>to appear for a short time or to make a sudden movement</i>
Sentence	<i>A smile flickered across her face.</i>

Word	Illuminate (verb)
Meaning	<i>to light something and make it brighter</i>
Sentence	The streets were illuminated with strings of coloured lights.

Word	Dazzling (adjective)
Meaning	<i>extremely attractive or exciting</i>
Sentence	Sam had a dazzling smile.

Word	Menacing (adjective)
Meaning	<i>making you think that someone is going to do something bad</i>
Sentence	Sam gave David a menacing look.

Word	Ominous (adjective)
Meaning	<i>suggesting that something unpleasant is likely to happen</i>
Sentence	<i>The engine had been making an ominous sound all the way from my parents' house.</i>

Word	Arrow (noun)
Meaning	<i>a sign consisting of a straight line with an upside down V shape at one end of it that points in a particular direction, used to show where something is</i>
Sentence	I followed the arrows to the car park.

Word	Spear (noun)
Meaning	<i>a weapon consisting of a pole with a sharp, usually metal, point at one end, that is either thrown or held in the hand</i>
Sentence	Alex found the spear after discovering an ancient Roman ruin.

Word	Decay (noun)
Meaning	<i>the state or process of rotting or decomposition.</i>
Sentence	Sugar is a major cause of tooth decay.
