

Word	sneered (verb)
Meaning	<i>To smile or speak in a contemptuous or mocking manner.</i>
Sentence	She sneered at their choice.

Word	snorted (verb)
Meaning	<i>make a sudden explosive sound through one's nose, especially to express indignation or derision.</i>
Sentence	She snorted with laughter.

Word	sniggered (verb)
Meaning	<i>laugh in a half-suppressed, typically scornful way</i>
Sentence	Even after being given into trouble, the group continued to snigger .

Word	jeered (verb)
Meaning	<i>make rude and mocking remarks, typically in a loud voice</i>
Sentence	The crowd jeered and heckled the leaders.

Word	harsh (adjective)
Meaning	<i>cruel or severe</i>
Sentence	It was a time of harsh military discipline.

Word	cruel(adjective)
Meaning	<i>wilfully causing pain or suffering to others, or feeling no concern about it.</i>
Sentence	He gave a cruel look.

Word	venomous (adjective)
Meaning	<i>full of malice or spite</i>
Sentence	She replied with a venomous glance.

Word	manor (noun)
Meaning	<i>a large country house with lands.</i>
Sentence	This weekend we will visit the manor house.

Word	timber (noun)
Meaning	<i>wood prepared for use in building and carpentry</i>
Sentence	The floor was made of timber .

Word	shutters (noun)
Meaning	<i>each of a pair of hinged panels fixed inside or outside a window that can be closed for security or privacy or to keep out the light.</i>
Sentence	He threw open the shutters to let in air and light.
