# 160 Years Old!

#### 160 years ago...

1861 - A school for infants was begun on the Grove site. This school was later named St. Saviours.



#### Then 150 years ago...

1871 - The foundation stone for a boys' junior school was laid behind the church at the Broadway site. The boys school opened in Jan 1872 and then in 1885 a girls' junior school was built next to the church. These schools later combined to make Christ Church Junior School.

#### Then 10 years ago...

2011 - St. Saviour's Infants and Christ Church Juniors merged together to become one new school.




So in 2021 we are celebrating THREE anniversaries....
