



At the end of the story Jesus tells us the Samaritan took the man to an inn, stayed overnight with him and then gave two coins to the innkeeper so the man could be looked after. The Samaritan said that he would return and pay the innkeeper any extra money that had been needed to look after the man. **Wow!**





Imagine you are the injured man who has been looked after in the inn.

What would you say to the Samaritan when he returned to the inn?
