Florence Nightingale 1820 - 1910

Mary Seacole 1805 - 1881

Her father was a Scottish soldier and her mother was a Jamaican nurse.

When she heard about the Crimean War she wanted to help.

Mary used her own money and medicines to help care for wounded soldiers.

Mary was so caring soldiers named her 'Mother Seacole'.
