- All learning at CtS centres around reading.



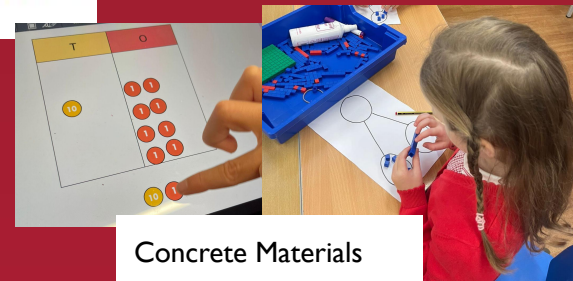

Year 2 History Remembrance

War

First World War Timeline

- 1914 - War begins.
- 1918 - War ends. The armistice is signed.
- 11th November 1919 - The First Remembrance day is held.

What is Remembrance day?	Remembrance Day is the day when we remember soldiers who died in the First World War and other wars.
When was the First World War?	The First World War took place over a hundred year ago .
When is Remembrance day?	Remembrance Day is on 11th November every year.
Why do we wear poppies?	We wear poppies because after the First World War, poppies grew in the fields where the fighting took place.

armistice: An agreement to end fighting.

trench: Trenches were long narrow ditches dug into the ground. They were where soldiers lived while they were waiting to fight.

No Man's Land: No Man's Land describes the area of land between two enemy trenches which 'no man' has taken yet.

Flanders Field: During the First World War Flanders Fields was a major battle.

veteran: Someone who fought in the war is a veteran.

Cenotaph: The Cenotaph is an important war memorial in London.

A soldier lays a wreath at the Cenotaph.

Y2 Seas and Coasts: What are British Seas, Oceans and Coasts like?

ocean: An ocean is a large area of salt water surrounded by land.

sea: A smaller part of the ocean, partly surrounded by land.

island: An area of land surrounded by water. The UK has over 6,000 islands.

continent: A continent is a very large, solid area of land. Earth has seven continents.

country: A country is an area of land with its own wall of rock, usually on the coast.

cliff: A vertical (straight up) or near-vertical wall of rock, usually on the coast.

coast: A coast is where the land meets the sea.

harbour: A harbour is a place on the coast where ships may shelter.
