


Year 3 Geography: Where does our Food come from? Key Topics: food from temperate climate zones, food from tropical climate zones, food from mediterranean climates, land use in the UK





arable	Arable land is land that is used to grow crops.	Mediterranean climate	The mediterranean climate zone is part of the temperate zone; it has long, hot dry summers.
climate zone	A climate zone is an area of the world that has similar weather patterns.	Northern Hemisphere	The half of the world <b>above</b> the equator
exported	Food that is grown in the UK and sold to other countries is <b>exported</b> .	pastoral	Pastoral land is used to raising animals (livestock) like sheep and cows.
imported	Food that is grown in other countries and brought into the UK is <b>imported</b> .	rapeseed	Rapeseed is a crop grown in the UK; oil is made from the rapeseed and also biodiesel to power cars.
Fair Trade	Fair Trade makes sure that farmers and producers are paid a fair price and a fair wage.	Southern Hemisphere	The half of the world below the equator.
lines of latitude	Imaginary lines we draw on the earth that run <b>parallel</b> to the equator around the earth.	temperate climate	A temperate climate has warm summers, cool winters and moderate rainfall
lines of longitude	Imaginary lines we draw on the earth that run vertically from the north to the south poles.	tropical climate	A tropical climate has hot, wet weather.
