<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Non-theistic - there is no named God or deity Life is one of suffering Enlightenment or nirvana is achieved through meditation Belief in reincarnation

<p>The 5Ks Kesh (uncut hair), Kara (steel bangle), Kangha (wooden comb), Kachera (shorts), Kirpan (sword) Live honestly and work hard</p>

Place of worship:	Mandir (Hindu temple)
Key Festivals:	Diwali and Holi
<p>Lead a good life as the next life will depend on how your present life is lived. Hindus try and care for every living thing, plants, animals and humans.</p>

Place of worship:	Buddhist Temple
Key Festivals:	Buddha's Birthday (Wesak), Nirvana Day
<p>Follow the teaching of Buddha, the eightfold path to enlightenment which includes right speech and right action such as honesty and kindness. Meditate on the Four Noble Truths.</p>
