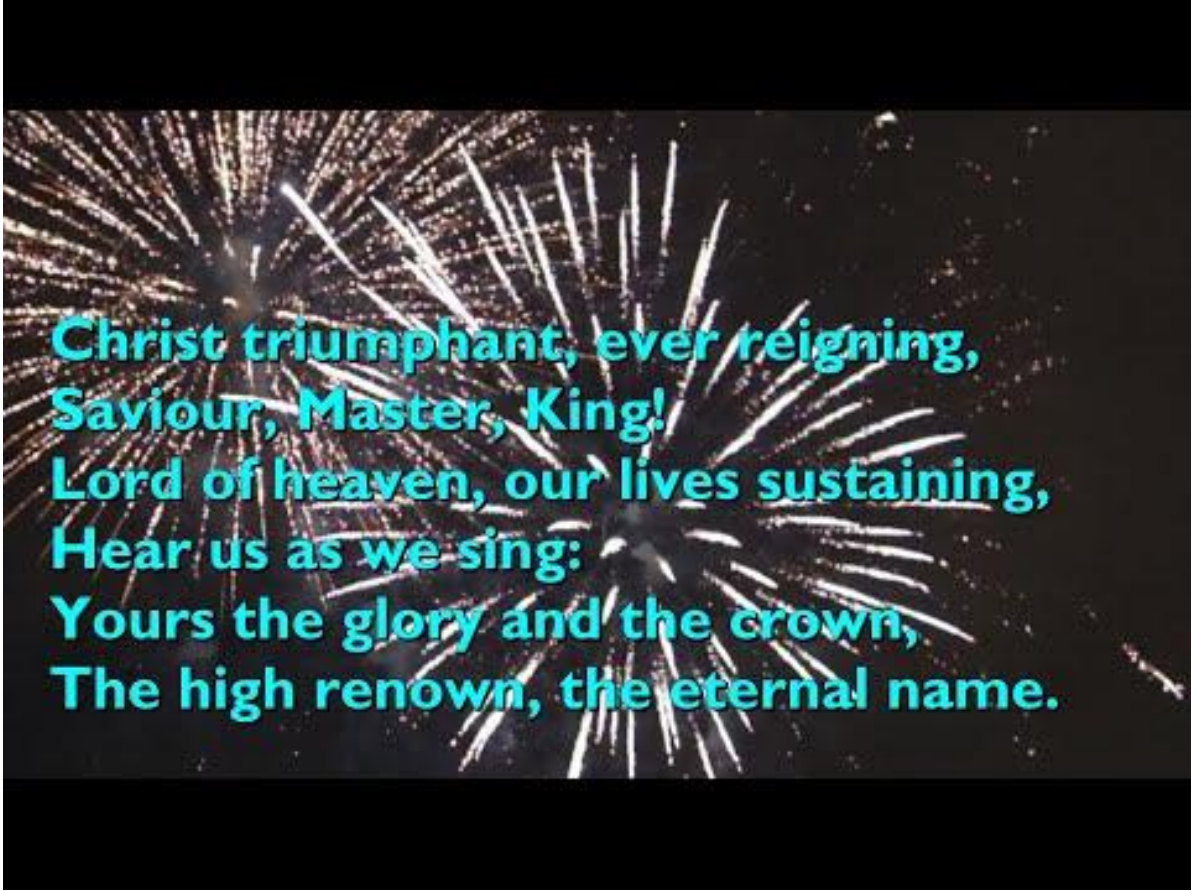

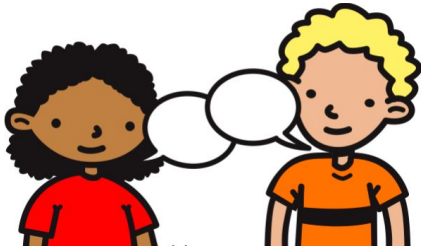

hear us as we sing:

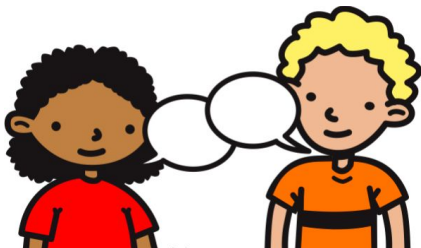
