




Do you remember who wrote the words to 'Make me a Channel of your peace' and when he wrote it?

St Francis of Assisi who lived over 800 years ago!




Make me a channel of your peace,

Injury in this song means to hurt to someone's feelings, someone has been upset.




Pardon means **forgiveness**






Make me a channel of your peace,
