
Collective Worship Hymn Reflection







The song 'Kum ba ya' was first sung over a hundred years ago in the south of the U.S.A - it is a folk song with roots in African culture. This type of song is called an African American spiritual.



'Kum ba ya' means "Come by here"

In each verse the song writer mentions a different situation where they would like God to be near them.
