## Pupil Reports

We are pleased to be sending our end of year report cards home in book bags today. In addition to the report cards, we will also share with parents the outcomes of the national statutory assessments that children have completed this academic year in the following year groups:

- Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check results
- Year 6 SATs scores

## Excellent Statutory Assessment Outcomes

We are absolutely delighted with the statutory assessment outcomes which recognise our determined ambition for an aspirational and inclusive curriculum offer and reinforce our own evaluation of the school.

We have achieved extremely strong phonics results once again in Year 1 with a 94% pass rate and the strong systems we have developed across the school ensure our pupils are developing their decoding and fluency skills alongside a passion for reading in order to develop lifelong reading habits.

Our Year 4 pupils are very confident with the Multiplication Tables Check - a quick fire online test of 25 times tables up to 12x12; and we have noticed the impact on our arithmetic scores in Year 6 as a result of these strong foundations in Year 4.

We are also very, very proud of our Year 6 cohort who gained some absolutely excellent SATS results this week. Our Year 6 pupils have bucked the national trend and have gained results which surpass our pre-covid levels. This is the result of a broad and balanced curriculum, strong teaching year on year, excellent support for emotional literacy and targeted interventions when needed. Pupils have been given their individual results today and they have had an opportunity to celebrate their achievements with their classmates. Our Year 6 cohort were incredibly well prepared for the SATS in May, and approached them in an extremely mature and confident manner with many children really looking forward to the experience and bursting to show their parents and teachers just how much they know! We are delighted that they move on to secondary school with this positive experience of national tests and some really fantastic results for which they should be very proud!

The national data has just been published and we are pleased to provide a comparative report showing our KS2 school results for 2025 and comparative national data for 2025 (\*2024 where the National data is not currently available). Our outcomes are very strong and particularly high again this year for pupils gaining the higher standard in Year 6 showing the impact of the strategic decisions taken to ensure we have excellent outcomes for all our pupils.

We continue to be committed to an aspirational curriculum enhanced by specialist teachers for French, Art, music and PE as well as specialist teaching assistants, a dramatherapist and an educational psychologist. We run a very tight school budget and we are extremely grateful to all the parents who have supported the school financially this year through PTA events or through payments to our school maintenance fund; these donations help relieve the financial pressure and enable us to purchase resources (PTA) and help with costly health and safety demands (Maintenance Fund) to free up other income to support with staffing costs without which we could not maintain our current staffing structure. We ask parents to login to ParentPay and ensure all outstanding payments owed to the school are cleared before the end of term.

### Attendance and Punctuality

We are very pleased with our attendance figures for this academic year, with our whole school (statutory) attendance at 96.4%.
