# School maintenance fund



At CtS, we are fortunate to have excellent teaching facilities, and a safe, nurturing environment. This is thanks to our planned, ongoing programme of building maintenance and development, and generations of parents of previous CtS pupils whose donations have contributed to the high standard of facilities we enjoy today.

As a voluntary aided school, we do not receive full government funding for building works, so need to make up the shortfall via School Maintenance Fund contributions from parents. The Governing Body manages the School Maintenance Fund to support spending on school facilities not covered by government funding. Contributions are voluntary and according to your means. Most parents make the recommended contribution of £84 per pupil per year. Families fortunate enough to have the means to contribute more do so - and we are grateful for this.



#### How the fund is used

School funding at a national level has persistently fallen short of both cost inflation and broader wage inflation, so the contributions we receive to the maintenance fund are as critical as ever.

A significant proportion of Christ the Saviour's maintenance fund goes towards the insurance, maintenance and refurbishment of school facilities for the benefit of current and future pupils.

In the 2024–25 financial year our maintenance programme has delivered:

- New heating system across the Grove Site to ensure classrooms are never cold in the winter months
- Upgraded Wi-Fi system
- Professional cleaning of our soft pore playground surfaces to maintain its high quality
- Electrical testing across both sites
- Tree surveys
- Maintenance audits and associated repairs

## How much to pay

- 12 monthly payments of £7 per month; or
- three termly payments of £28 per term; or
- one-off annual payment of £84
