Dear Parents,

We have had a very settled start to the new term with some excitement during the snowfall earlier this week! Pupils have quickly re-established their routines, engaged with new curriculum learning and welcomed a few new pupils to our school community. We are delighted to welcome Miss Case who joins our Senior Leadership Team as SENCO and to welcome back Ms Afonso who returns as Head of Year 4 after her maternity leave. Attendance

We continue to be really pleased with the excellent attendance across the school. Our whole school attendance was 96.3% last term with attendance figures for each year group below. We are delighted to see that so many year groups have attendance above 96%, which is the percentage classified as 'good attendance' by the DFE. All those pupils who have attendance of 97% and above will be receiving their attendance badges to put on their blazers next week.

A special congratulations to our Year 5 cohort who have the highest average attendance in the school and a shout out to 3HU which is the class with the highest attendance in the school of 98.3%! Each week we celebrate our attendance figures and remind children of the different ways to keep themselves healthy e.g eating a rainbow plate, getting exercise each day and going to bed early to ensure a good night's sleep!

Broadway Lunch Routines

Next week, we will be introducing new lunchtime routines at the Broadway Site to improve our system of food waste recycling and increase pupil independence and responsibility. Year groups will eat their lunches at the same time as their usual lunch sitting and the menu remains the same. The main changes are as follows:

1. Children will be reminded to only ask for as much food as they can eat and to try to eat everything on their plate
2. Children will recycle food waste at our recycling stations (only **food waste** goes in the food waste bin)
3. Children who have a packed lunch will bring their rubbish and any leftover food home. This will ensure parents know how much their child is eating at lunchtime and reduce the food waste at school.

Operation Encompass

Parents should be aware that we are part of Operation Encompass, a national police and school partnership making it a statutory duty for police to inform schools about domestic abuse incidents which involve children. Domestic violence and abuse incidents are shared with the schools DSL prior to the start of the next school day. The Information shared by the police includes:

- Context of DVA
- Information about whether the child was in the home/ premises
- Time of incident
- Adults involved
- Voice of the child including their demeanour

This is a silent support system and the school does not investigate any incidents that have taken place outside school however staff will use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to enable support to be given, depending on the needs of the child. The school may also be able to make additional provision or adjustments to assist the child and their family.
