Safer Internet Day

As we prepare for Safer Internet Day pupils have been reminded about the wise choices they must make when they are online. Safer Internet Day is a global awareness day that encourages children and adults to think carefully about how we use the online world and digital technology. It’s a useful annual prompt to refresh conversations about online safety, wellbeing and responsible digital behaviour.

The focus this year is on: **Smart Tech, safe choices – exploring the safe and responsible use of AI**

This reflects how quickly AI and smart technologies are becoming part of children’s everyday online experiences. It is an opportunity for us to reinforce our online safety messages such as:

- Always use age appropriate apps
- Have a screen time limit every day if you are a regular user of technology
- Make sure parental controls are on
- Less screen time, more play time!
- 1 **hour** a day online is over 15 **days** online a year.
- Always tell an adult if you see something that makes you sad or uncomfortable.

Some of our Year 6 digital leaders made a video to tell us all a bit more about AI and to offer some additional advice. This video can be found on our [Online Safety page](#) of our school website. In our PSHE lessons this week, children have had a chance to learn more about AI and to discuss how to use it safely. This complements our KS2 safeguarding curriculum which teaches children about mis information, disinformation and fake news.

Health and Wellbeing Survey Data

We regularly use pupil surveys to support our curriculum development. We are sharing the data from a Health and Wellbeing survey carried out with Year 4 and Year 6 pupils last term. The data in brackets is comparative data for these year groups in Ealing primary schools.

- 74% (80%) of our children play online games at least once a week

- 32% (44%) of boys and 17% (26%) of girls said they play online games 'every day' in their own time or in school clubs
- 44% (51%) of pupils said they chat online to friends of friends.
- 13% (17%) of pupils said they chat online to people who they don't know in real life.
- 18% (18%) of boys and 16% (18%) of girls responded that they have received a message or picture that scared them or made them upset
- 28% (44%) of pupils have their own smartphone with internet access

We respond to these surveys with adjustments to our safeguarding and online safety curriculum and ask parents to reinforce key safeguarding messages at home e.g:

- not talking to people you don't know online
- friends of friends are not people you know
- children must always tell an adult if they see anything that makes them upset
