The season of Lent has begun and during this time we are all encouraged to draw closer to God. This year, Ramadam is taking place at the same time as Lent. This is also a special time of year for Muslims who take time to draw closer to God through worship and self discipline.

Lent Charities

We can draw closer to God by helping others and, with the help of our Broadway school council reps, we have chosen Ealing Soup Kitchen as our Lent charity this year. They are a fantastic, local charity that runs a weekend Soup Kitchen providing hot food for those who need it at St Johns Church, Ealing. Over the next few weeks our children will hear more about this charity and how we can support them in their work. As part of our learning about serving others, we will also be taking part in the [Great Big School Clean](#) between 13th and 29th March when children will be encouraged to gain a sense of responsibility for their surroundings and local community.

Some of our Year 3 worship leaders have visited classrooms today to distribute our Lent booklets with lots of activities for children to complete at home as they draw closer to God over the 40 days of Lent.

Whilst we were unable to worship together for our usual Ash Wednesday service, which fell during half term, our first Broadway Mass saw a rich array of seasonal worship with exceptional leadership from three different year group choirs and new servers- in- training. A small group drawn from Year 5 choir expertly guided us through Psalm 51. With over 50 children in Year 3 choir, voices rose to a mighty crescendo at the end of "Christ be our Light" following their beautiful rendition of Kyrie eleison. Music remains at the heart of our worship, our school orchestra performed during celebration worship this morning and it is no surprise that our Year 6 leavers continue to gain musical scholarships to local and independent schools.

Parent Survey

A big thank you to the parents who completed our parent survey at the end of last half term. This was very helpful data for the school as we received responses from over a quarter of parents in each year group. 98% of parents said their child is happy at school and 97% said their child feels safe at school. This is in line with our pupil responses as well as the general feeling of belonging and strong friendships in each year group. We were very pleased with the positive feedback from parents of pupils with SEND which is significantly above the data for schools like ours and reflects the work we have put in place over the last 2 years to support the implementation of individual small step plans for all pupils with

SEND. We will continue to review the individual responses to the parent survey and share this information with key staff and year groups.

The Schools White Paper and SEND reform

There has been a lot of information in the news this week about educational changes in response to the publication of the Schools White Paper.
