



Year 1 Science - How do seasons change?

Key Vocabulary

Season	In the UK, there are four seasons. Each season lasts about three months and has different weather. The weather is also different in different parts of the UK as well
Winter	The coldest season with the shortest days, it can be stormy with lots of rain, wind, ice and snow.
Spring	The season when the days start to get warmer, it can be sunny or rainy. Plants start to grow and flower, and lots of animals give birth.
Summer	The season with the hottest, sunniest days although there still may be some cooler or cloudier days.
Autumn	The season when the days get shorter and cooler and there is usually more wind and rain.

Summer is the warmest season, with longer days and lots of sunshine (sometimes. People enjoy outdoor activities more during this time.



Winter is the coldest season with the shortest days. It may snow, and many trees lose their leaves. People often wear warmer clothes.



Spring is when flowers start to bloom and trees grow new leaves. The weather starts to get warmer and it often rains



Autumn is when leaves change colour and fall from trees. The weather gets cooler, and days become shorter.
