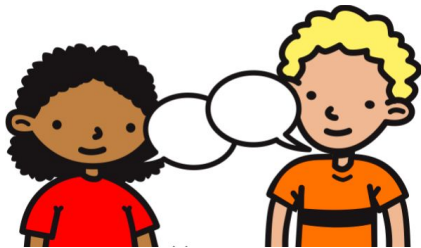


This song has some unusual

The words of this song  
are from the bible -  
they were written by  
the prophet **Isaiah**  
around 700 years  
before Jesus was  
born! That means  
these words are **2700**  
**years old!**
