Dear Parents,

Excellent Statutory Assessment Outcomes

We are very pleased with the statutory assessment outcomes which recognise our determined ambition for a school where children belong with high academic standards alongside inclusive practice.

We have achieved strong phonics results in Year 1 once again with a 92% pass rate. The strong systems we have developed across the school ensure our pupils are developing their decoding and fluency skills alongside a passion for reading in order to develop lifelong reading habits. All children in Year 2 will be moving up to the Broadway Site having passed their phonics screening check either in Year 1 or Year 2.

Our Year 4 pupils are very confident with the Multiplication Tables Check - a quick fire online test of 25 times tables up to 12x12; 50% of our year 4 cohort scored full marks (compared to 37% nationally in 2025) and this is an achievement not just of their multiplication skills but also their quick responses on the computer!

We are very proud of our Year 6 cohort who gained some excellent SATS results which were published this morning due to a national delay. Pupils have been given their individual results today which will come home in sealed envelopes. Our Year 6 cohort were extremely well prepared for the SATS in May, and approached them in a mature and confident manner. We are delighted they will move on to secondary school with this positive experience of national tests and some fantastic results for which they should be very proud!

The national data has just been published and we are pleased to provide a comparative report showing our KS2 school results for 2026 and comparative national data for 2026 (*2025 where the National data is not currently available). Our outcomes are very strong and particularly high again this year for pupils gaining the higher standard in Year 6 showing the impact of the strategic decisions taken to ensure we have excellent outcomes for all our pupils.

We continue to be committed to an aspirational curriculum enhanced by specialist teachers for French, Art, music and PE as well as specialist teaching assistants, a dramatherapist and an educational psychologist. We are thrilled that our PE Lead Ms Jolliffe was commended for her leadership and gained a PE Lead of the Year award - although she was on a residential trip so had to record her acceptance speech from the lake!

Attendance and Punctuality

We are very pleased with our attendance figures for this academic year, with our whole school (statutory) attendance at 96.1%. Our attendance has dipped a little in the last few weeks due to the extreme heat and the school remaining open as well as a high number of children absent due to chicken pox and several families taking unauthorised early holidays.

We will continue to work hard with families who have children with poor attendance to address any barriers.

Maintenance Fund
